To install OHFont or OHFontBold:

1. Download the Original Hebrew Font Zip File from fathersalphabet.com/downloads
2. Extract the Zip File
3. Right click on "OHfont.ttf" or "OHfontbold.ttf" and then click preview
4. Click on install
5. Close
6. Your font installation is complete

How to use the font once it has been installed:

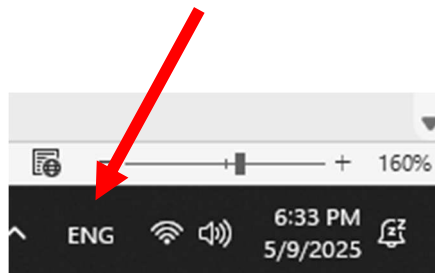
Option 1: Enable the Hebrew Standard Keyboard

- Most computers come with a free Hebrew keyboard, you just need to enable it. Instructions for Windows 11 and iPad are provided below. For all other devices, please do a web search for “how to enable Hebrew keyboard on [insert your device name here].”
- Once the Hebrew keyboard is active, simply type the corresponding key for each Hebrew letter and select OHfont as your font. For example, pressing א will display as א

How to Enable the Hebrew Standard Keyboard on Windows 11:

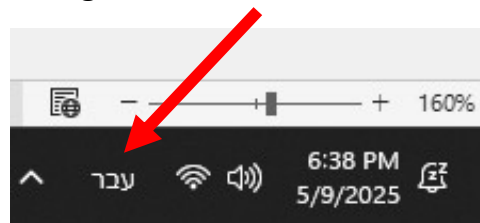
Go to Settings > Time and Language > Language & Region > Add a language

Type in “Hebrew” and follow prompts to install. Once installed you’ll see “ENG” on the bottom right corner of your PC:



On your PC, bring up the Onscreen Keyboard (Start > On-screen Keyboard), then click ENG at the bottom right of your screen. On the small window that pops up, Click Hebrew.

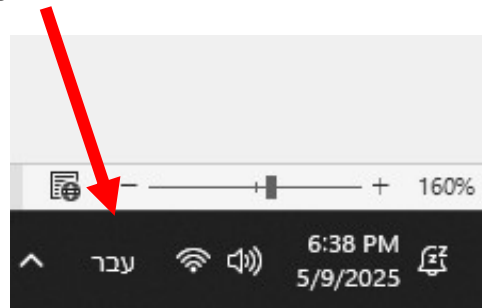
“ENG” will change to עבר and the onscreen keyboard will now display Hebrew characters along with the English letters.





Type the Hebrew characters you want to see, then change the font to OHfont.

To change your keyboard back to English, click עבר at the bottom right of your screen and select English.



Note: On Windows 10, sometimes “ENG” disappears. To fix this, click Start and type “Use the desktop language bar when it’s available.” Click it and a new screen will pop up. Click the first drop down that appears on that new screen and change it from English to Hebrew, then back to English. You should now see ENG at the bottom right of your screen again.

How to Enable the Hebrew Standard Keyboard on an iPad:

Note: OHfonts on iPad can only be used with apps supporting custom fonts, such as Adobe apps and third-party video editors like LumaFusion.

Go to Settings > General > Keyboard > Keyboards. Tap Add New Keyboard, then select Hebrew. Once added, switch to it the same way you access emojis.

Option 2: Use Hebrew Alphabet Alt Codes (PC only: Microsoft Word, Wordpad, PowerPoint)

- To use Alt Codes:
 1. Hold down the Alt key on your keyboard.
 2. While holding Alt, type the specific numeric code for the Hebrew letter on the numeric keypad.
 3. Release the Alt key, and the letter will appear.
- Refer to the table on the following page for the Alt Codes corresponding to each Hebrew character.
